God Preserves His Word



God's Word **CANNOT** be destroyed!

Luke 24:25-26

25 And he said to them, "O foolish ones, and slow of heart to believe all that the prophets have spoken!

26 Was it not necessary that the Christ should suffer these things and enter into his glory?"

Luke 24:27

27 And beginning with Moses and all the Prophets, he interpreted to them in all the Scriptures the things concerning himself.

Class Notes

- 1) While Jesus was alive, He taught from Moses and the Prophets.
- 2) The only Scriptures Jesus had were the Old Testament.

Jeremiah 36:1

1 In the fourth year of Jehoiakim the son of Josiah, king of Judah, this word came to Jeremiah from the LORD:

Jeremiah 36:2

2 Take a scroll and write on it all the words that I have spoken to you against Israel and Judah and all the nations, from the day I spoke to you, from the days of Josiah until today.

Class Notes

3) The Lord's Word came to His prophet, Jeremiah.

4) God told Jeremiah to write on a scroll.

5) God's message through Jeremiah said He would judge the wicked and sinful people.

Jeremiah 36:3

3 It may be that the house of Judah will hear all the disaster that I intend to do to them, so that every one may turn from his evil way, and that I may forgive their iniquity and their sin.

Class Notes

6) God wanted to warn the people of Judah that they would be punished if they kept sinning against Him.

Jeremiah 36:4

4 Then Jeremiah called Baruch the son of Neriah, and Baruch wrote on a scroll at the dictation of Jeremiah all the words of the LORD that he had spoken to him.

Jeremiah 36:22–23

22 It was the ninth month, and the king was sitting in the winter house, and there was a fire burning in the fire pot before him.

23 As Jehudi read three or four columns, the king would cut them off with a knife and throw them into the fire in the fire pot, until the entire scroll was consumed in the fire that was in the fire pot.

Class Notes

7) As King Jehoiakim heard God's Words, he became very angry.

8) He cut the scroll to pieces and threw it in the fire.

Jeremiah 36:32

Then Jeremiah took another scroll and gave it to Baruch the scribe, the son of Neriah, who wrote on it at the dictation of Jeremiah all the words of the scroll that Jehoiakim king of Judah had burned in the fire. And many similar words were added to them.

Class Notes

9) God's Word will stand forever. It will never be destroyed.
