Mt 4:18-19 And Jesus, walking by the Sea of Galilee, saw two brothers, Simon called Peter, and Andrew his brother, casting a net into the sea; for they were fishermen. ¹⁹ Then He said to them, "Follow Me, and I will make you fishers of men." ²⁰ They immediately left their nets and followed Him. "Another way to translate the expression, 'fishing for men,' would be, 'catching men alive.' We find this unique phrase only in Mt 4:19 and 2 Tim 2:26, where it describes those who have been ensnared by Satan. Thus, Scripture provides a striking contrast: either we will catch men and women alive or the devil will." Greg Laurie





"Have you ever thought about what a net is? It's a bunch of holes tied together. Do you know what a hole is? It's a 'nothing.' And that's exactly what we are – a bunch of 'nothings.' But if you take a bunch of nothings and tie them together, they become powerful.
