THE GREEK VIEW OF THE NATURE OF MAN

As we continue our journey in understanding Greek thinking, it will become more and more obvious what I am going to teach.


As we get more and more accustomed to this view, it will be very easy to detect the use of this thinking when we read commentaries or listen to most modern day sermons. How the very essence of man is seen is very important in understanding why modern Christianity has a difficult time teaching, believing, or accepting most of the Old Testament theology. or essence of man springs forth from Greek thinking and teaching. To the Greeks, man is dual, as we have covered many times. He is made up of flesh (body, physical, material, that which is carnal) and soul (mind, spirit, invisible, eternal, that which is holy or godly). It is the soul which is considered eternal and redeemed by the gods. It is the soul that ascends to the heavens.

for the soul. This is why commandments and laws from Scripture which primarily deal with the physical are irrelevant to the spiritual man. The anostic world has no need of higher governing laws, as laws are only for the weak. The Jews of the Janakh

their weak faith. To the Greek, the heart is good and the body is evil. When a brother sins or commits atrocious acts, it is merely evil flesh doing what it does by nature. Since the flesh or body does not enter into the heavens, then it does not matter what the body does. Here is how 1Corinthians 6:9-10 would be interpreted by Hellenistic or gnostic thinking: "Know ye not that the

shall inherit the kingdom of God." In gnostic thought only the flesh or physical does these things, the real you doesn't. The body is doing what comes naturally. So all things are lawful, acknowledging that some things are not good to do. Man is, in reality, a spirit being, and operates only in another existence, and the things of the world are mundane and for the weak. The soul belongs to the gods and the body is the product of a fallen world and can do no good. The sooner the soul leaves the body the better.




And the **disciples** were called **Christians** first in



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Deut 15:11-14


11 For the poor shall never cease out of the land: therefore I command thee, saying, Thou shalt open thine hand wide unto thy brother, to thy poor, and to thy needy, in thy land.



סַד:2555 סְרֶּלֶּן **chamac** (khaw-mawce'); from OT:2554; violence; by implication, wrong; by meton. unjust gain:

KJV - cruel (-ty), damage, false, injustice, * oppressor, unrighteous, violence (against, done), violent (dealing), wrong.

VIOLENCE – actions motivated through hatred or greed.

Greed motivated the rich and powerful to exploit the powerless, robbing them of their rightful property Amos condemned the wealthy leaders of Samaria for storing up "violence and robbery in their strongholds".

Various proverbs warn against following the path of those who enrich themselves by exploiting others. See also **EXTORT**; **OPPRESS**; **POOR**; **RICHES**

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Charges Against Judah:

- Dishonest in Business
