Federalism: a system of government in which different levels of government govern the area/people. The government is generally responsible for larger territorial and foreign issues while the State governments govern the issues of local concern. Additionally, the individual states also retain their from one another so that the distinctives of one state are by the cultural distinctives of the others.
In this way, the cultural/philosophical/religious beliefs of the citizens of the States/regions are protected from a overreaching government.
