







Ps 90:4 For a thousand years in Your sight are like yesterday when it is past, and like a watch in the night.


2 Pet **3:8** But, beloved, do not forget this one thing, that with the Lord one day is as a thousand years, and a thousand years as one day.

- The Romans had brought peace (*Pax Romana*), an excellent road system which facilitated travel, and a common currency interconnecting the world more than it had ever been.
- The Greek civilization had provided a common language and even though the Jews retained their native Hebrew tongue (Aramaic), they used Koine Greek when dealing with outsiders.
- The Jews had taught monotheism and the messianic hope in the synagogues of the Mediterranean world, so the people of that area were expectant.

- The prophecies related to Christ could not be fulfilled soon after their announcement lest men would say they were contrived.
- The Law of Moses had had enough time to be a "schoolmaster" convincing man that he could not earn God's acceptance and thus, needed a Savior (Rom 7:13, Gal 3:24).
- The Messiah (Shiloh) had to be born before the scepter departed from Judah (Gen 49:10).
- Anyone claiming the throne of David had to be able to prove their lineage using Temple records.
