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We speak of Devil's food cake, deviled ham, and call football teams the Devils. People like to make the devil laughable, but he is a very real enemy. It has always been the Devil's purpose to pull the veil of darkness over his kingdom and to have his existence denied for a while, but his goal always has been to be worshipped, so sooner or latter he will show himself and demand worship. It is important that we understand who the Devil is because if there is no concept of our enemy then there will be no preparation for the war. How is our enemy described?

## He was the top cherub

Ezk 28:12-19 "You were the seal of perfection, full of wisdom and perfect in beauty. <sup>13</sup> You were in Eden, the garden of God; every precious stone was your covering: the sardius, topaz, and diamond, beryl, onyx, and jasper, sapphire, turquoise, and emerald with gold.
