

 - To perfect to show it forth in its true meaning.


Old Testament

We see the beginning of Creation, the judgment of man, God's call to Abram, the Covenant with Israel, the birth of the nation, the conquest of the Promised Land, the call to guidance, the call to repentance, the judgment of Israel with the Promise of return, the Pre-exile and Post-exile prophets all pointing to the Messiah and a literal Kingdom on the Earth. 
- Deut 6:5 And thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thine heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy might.

- 5 But ye say, Whosoever shall say to his father or his mother, It is a gift, by whatsoever thou mightest be profited by me;


- 6 And honour not his father or his mother, he shall be free. Thus have ye made the commandment of God of none effect by your tradition.
- 7 Ye hypocrites, well did Esaias prophesy of you, saying,

- 9 But in vain they do worship me, teaching for doctrines the commandments of men.



2) Jesus fulfilled what the Law and the Prophets said of the Messiah.

Matt 16:1-4

The Pharisees also with the Sadducees came, and tempting desired him that he would shew them a sign from heaven. He answered and said unto them, When it is evening, ye say, It will be fair weather: for the sky is red. And in the morning, It will be foul weather to day: for the sky is red and lowring. O ye hypocrites, ye can discern the face of the sky; but can ye not discern the signs of the times? A wicked and adulterous generation seeketh after a sign; and there shall no sign be given unto it, but the sign of the prophet Jonas. And he left them, and departed.



And Paul, as his manner was, went in unto them, and three sabbath days reasoned with them out of the scriptures, Opening and alleging, that Christ must needs have suffered, and risen again from the dead; and that this Jesus. whom I preach unto you, is Christ.

3) Jesus fulfilled our Obligation to the Law.

1. Showed us God's Heart and Morality for Man – The Law.

God's morality does not change. These truths still stand today.

2. It contained God's civil law for Israel – The Judgements.

Still good common sense and wise to do.
Many laws in America were modeled after Biblical judgements.

3. It contained the Religious Law for Israel

- the Statutes of Sacrificial Worship.
- Fulfilled by Christ.


3) Jesus fulfilled our Obligation to the Law.

- 1. He was Perfect. He fulfilled our obligation to the Law.
- 2. He gave His life as the Perfect Sacrifice to atone for our sins. (He fulfilled our debt to the Law.)

- 27 And as it is appointed unto men once to die, but after this the judgment:
- 28 So Christ was once offered to bear the sins of many; and unto them that look for him shall he appear the second time without sin unto salvation.
- 10 For the law having a shadow of good things to come, and not the very image of the things, can never with those sacrifices which they offered year by year continually make the comers thereunto perfect.
- 2 For then would they not have ceased to be offered? because that the worshippers once purged should have had no more conscience of sins.
- 3 But in those sacrifices there is a remembrance again made of sins every year.

- 4 For it is not possible that the blood of bulls and of goats should take away sins.
- 5 Wherefore when he cometh into the world, he saith, Sacrifice and offering thou wouldest not, but a body hast thou prepared me:
- 6 In burnt offerings and sacrifices for sin thou hast had no pleasure.
- 7 Then said I, Lo, I come (in the volume of the book it is written of me,) to do thy will, O God.
- 8 Above when he said, Sacrifice and offering and burnt offerings and offering for sin thou wouldest not, neither hadst pleasure therein; which are offered by the law;

- 9 Then said he, Lo, I come to do thy will, O God. He taketh away the first, that he may establish the second. 10 By the which will we are sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all. 11 And every priest standeth daily ministering and offering oftentimes the same sacrifices, which can never take away sins:
- 12 But this man, after he had offered one sacrifice for sins for ever, sat down on the right hand of God; 13 From henceforth expecting till his enemies be made his footstool.
- 14 For by one offering he hath perfected for ever them that are sanctified.
