



## Righteousness is the goal.

Not "self-righteousness."

#### Matt 7:1-5

Judge not, that ye be not judged. For with what judgment ye judge, ye shall be judged: and with what measure ye mete, it shall be measured to you again. And why beholdest thou the mote that is in thy brother's eye, but considerest not the beam that is in thine own eye? Or how wilt thou say to thy brother, Let me pull out the mote out of thine eye; and, behold, a beam is in thine own eye? Thou hypocrite, first cast out the beam out of thine own eye; and then shalt thou see clearly to cast out the mote out of thy brother's eye. Give not that which is holy unto the dogs, neither cast ye your pearls before swine, lest they trample them under their feet, and turn again and rend you.




#### The Bible commands us to use judgement...

- The Bible establishes the place and purpose of civil government and the accompanying judgement. (Deut 16:8, Romans 13:1-4)
- The Bible establishes how judgement is used to handle disputes between believers within the assembly. (Matthew 18, 1 Cor. 6:1-8)
- The Bible establishes judgment for behavior within the local church body. (1 Cor. 5 & 6, Romans 16:17-18, 2 Thes. 3:6)
- The Bible establishes our use of judgment for doctrinal issues being taught. (1 Cor 14:29, 1 John 4:1)
- The Bible teaches the judgment of those considered for positions of deacon and pastor. (1 Tim. 3:1-13)
- We are to judge our own behavior. (1 Cor. 10:31-32, 1 Peter 1:14-16))
- We are to be able to judge what is right and wrong. (1 Thes 5:22)

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# This passage actually deals more with US than others.

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This passage does not tell us not to judge, it tells us how to judge righteously.

### 1) Give the other person every benefit of the doubt.

Luke 6:36-42

Be ye therefore merciful, as your Father also is merciful. Judge not, and ye shall not be judged: condemn not, and ye shall not be condemned: forgive, and ye shall be forgiven: Give, and it shall be given unto you; good measure, pressed down, and shaken together, and running over, shall men give into your bosom. For with the same measure that ye mete withal it shall be measured to you again...And why beholdest thou the mote that is in thy brother's eye, but perceivest not the beam that is in thine own eye? Either how canst thou say to thy brother, Brother, let me pull out the mote that is in thine eye, when thou thyself beholdest not the beam that is in thine own eye? Thou hypocrite, cast out first the beam out of thine own eye, and then shalt thou see clearly to pull out the mote that is in thy brother's Peyeir - Real Christianity: The Sermon On The Mount - Using Judgment Properly


#### Dealing with others



# 2) Before judging others, first use the same strict standards to judge yourself.










## 3) Apply God's Counsel to Yourself.




Phil 4:1-5
