
# **The Olivet Discourse**

Abraham, Moses, David, Elijah, Jeremiah – were all men of faith who were Jewish



### 1 Corinthians 10:32

Apostle Paul, 25 years after the resurrection, still identified three people groups.



Having the Bible divided by Old and New Testament is misleading. The only Bible the church had for two decades was the OT. It is ONE revelation from God.


#### Like diagraming a sentence, remember who was being addressed in Scripture.

- All Scripture is FOR our benefit, but not all of it was written TO US.
- We learn from the story of Noah, but we don't build literal arks. We learn from Adam, but we aren't forbidden from eating any specific fruit.


## AGE OF MESSIAH

- Ps 2:6-9 Yet have I set my king upon my holy hill of Zion. I will declare the decree: the Lord hath said unto me, Thou art my Son; this day have I begotten thee. Ask of me, and I shall give thee the heathen for thine inheritance, and the uttermost parts of the earth for thy possession. Thou shalt break them with a rod of iron; thou shalt dash them in pieces like a potter's vessel.
- Isa 9:6-7 For unto us a child is born, unto us a son is given: and the government shall be upon his shoulder: and his
  name shall be called Wonderful, Counsellor, The mighty God, The everlasting Father, The Prince of Peace. Of the
  increase of his government and peace there shall be no end, upon the throne of David, and upon his kingdom, to
  order it, and to establish it with judgment and with justice from henceforth even for ever. The zeal of the Lord of hosts
  will perform this.
- Luke 1:30-33 And the angel said unto her, Fear not, Mary: for thou hast found favour with God. And, behold, thou shalt conceive in thy womb, and bring forth a son, and shalt call his name JESUS. He shall be great, and shall be called the Son of the Highest: and the Lord God shall give unto him the throne of his father David: And he shall reign over the house of Jacob for ever; and of his kingdom there shall be no end.
- Isa 2:2-4 And it shall come to pass in the last days, that the mountain of the Lord's house shall be established in the top of the mountains, and shall be exalted above the hills; and all nations shall flow unto it. And many people shall go and say, Come ye, and let us go up to the mountain of the Lord, to the house of the God of Jacob; and he will teach us of his ways, and we will walk in his paths: for out of Zion shall go forth the law, and the word of the Lord from Jerusalem. And he shall judge among the nations, and shall rebuke many people: and they shall beat their swords into plowshares, and their spears into pruninghooks: nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war any more.

After the flood, God chose Israel to be His nation through which He would rule the world. He foretold of His King who would rule and reign from the Throne of David. (Ps. 2, Is. 9:6, Luke 1, Isaiah 11)

## Three Conquests Three Prophets

606BC – Daniel taken to Babylon


597BC - Ezekiel take to Tel Aviv

Ezekiel called about 592BC.

586BC – Jerusalem destroyed (Jeremiah)



Israel was driven out of the land, but God will keep His promises. God's timeline and His focus is outlined in Daniel 2, 7 and 9.

#### Dan 9:26-27

<sup>26</sup> And after threescore and two weeks shall **Messiah be cut off**, but not for himself: and the people of the prince that shall come shall **destroy the city** and **the sanctuary**; and the end thereof shall be with a flood, and unto the end of the war desolations are determined.

<sup>27</sup> And he shall confirm the covenant with many for one week: and in the midst of the week he shall cause the sacrifice and the oblation to cease, and for the overspreading of abominations he shall make it desolate, even until the consummation, and that determined shall be poured upon the desolate.

The Olivet Discourse is one of the most important passages in the Bible because it is Jesus Himself teaching about these judgments mentioned by Daniel – the destruction of the Temple AND the desolation of the Temple.


## **Two Views on the Tribulation**

### Preterist

- The Olivet Discourse and the Book of Revelation were fulfilled in the conquest of Jerusalem in 70 AD.
- God is done with Israel.
- Israel today is a fraud. The Church has replaced Israel.
- No rapture, no millennium, no antichrist, no tribulation.
- Christ's Second Coming is only spiritual and not literal.

### **Futurist**

- The Seventieth Week of Daniel (detailed in Revelation) is yet future.
- God will keep His promises to Israel.
- The Church is distinct from the Nation of Israel.
- Literal rapture, millennium, anti-christ and tribulation.
- The Kingdom of Heaven promised by God to Abraham, Daniel, etc., is a literal Kingdom on Earth.

### One Thousand Years of Shabbat



R. Katina said, "Six thousand years the world will exist and one [thousand, the seventh], it shall be desolate (*haruv*), as it is written, 'And the Lord **alone** shall be exalted in that day' (Isa. 2:11).<sup>1</sup> ... R. Katina also taught, "Just as the seventh year is one year of release (*mushmetet*) in seven, so too does the world have one thousand years out of seven that are fallow (*mushmat*), as it is written, 'And the Lord **alone** shall be exalted in that day' (Isa. 2:11); and further it is written, 'A psalm and song for the Shabbat day' (Ps. 92:1) – meaning the day that is altogether Shabbat – and also it is said, 'For a thousand years in Thy sight are but as yesterday when it is past' (Ps. 90:4)."<sup>2</sup>


Traditional Judaism believes in a literal Kingdom on earth - Jewish Talmud



The early church believed in the literal interpretation of the reign of Christ.

Not until the 4<sup>th</sup> Century in Augustine's work, "City of God" that Christianity began to allegorize the Bible rather than take it literally. You can understand is error. Israel had not existed for several centuries. The state Church was now exalted by Rome rather than persecuted.

If after 2000 years, Israel becomes a nation, if Jerusalem becomes a city which all the nations of the world argue over, if you see a rise toward global government, if you see a push towards controlling all trade through receiving some kind of mark, then you may want to rethink whether you believe this is literal or not.





## The Different Accounts give One Complete Presentation


#### Matt 24:21-22

## The Complete Discourse on the Mt. of Olives

**Luke:** Emphasizes the destruction of the Temple and the Persecution of the Jews which would take place in 70 AD **Matthew:** Emphasizes the Abomination of Desolation and the Persecution of the Jews at the end of the Age when Christ returns.




Luke 21:5-7

5 And as some **spake of the temple**, how it was adorned with goodly stones and gifts, he said, 6 As for these things (the temple complex) which

ye behold, the days will come, in the which there shall not be left one stone upon another, that shall not be thrown down.

7 And they asked him, saying, Master, but when shall these things be? and what sign will there be when these things shall come to pass?



#### Luke 21:10-12

Nation shall rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom: <sup>11</sup> And great earthquakes shall be in divers places, and famines, and pestilences; and fearful sights and great signs shall there be from heaven.

#### Luke 21:12-19


<sup>13</sup> And it shall turn to you for a testimony.

<sup>18</sup> But there shall not an hair of your head perish.




"Ye" – obviously didn't mean Peter, Andrew, James and John as they weren't in Jerusalem when this happened. In fact, three were dead. Jesus is addressing the Jewish people.



#### Luke 21:22-23


<sup>22</sup> For these be the days of vengeance, that all things which are written may be fulfilled.


#### Luke 21:24

And they (this people) shall fall by the edge of the sword, and shall be led away captive into all nations: and Jerusalem shall be trodden down of the Gentiles, until the times of the Gentiles be fulfilled.



### **Zech 9:9**

And when he was come near, he beheld the city, and wept over it, Saying, If thou hadst known, even thou, at least in this thy day, the things which belong unto thy peace! but now they are hid from thine eyes. For the days shall come upon thee, that thine enemies shall cast a trench about thee, and compass thee round, and keep thee in on every side, And shall lay thee even with the ground, and thy children within thee; and they shall not leave in thee one stone upon another; because thou knewest not the time of *thy visitation*.



# Contrasts in Olivet Discourse

### Luke

- Before these things
- Focus of Luke is local, the destruction of the Temple.
- Luke's focus is the distress in the land of Judaea and the continuation of Jerusalem being trodden underfoot by the Gentiles.
- The warning to flee in Luke revolves around Jerusalem being surrounded by an invading army.

### Matthew

- After these things
- Matthew focuses on signs of Christ's coming and the end of the age.
- Matthew speaks of tribulation spanning all of the world and "no flesh being saved."
- The focus in Matthew is the Abomination of Desolations of which Daniel foretold.
