





This is what it's all about. All the great religious leaders in world history have great monoments marking the place of their burial and a are still occupied, yet this one – the Garden Tomb is empty.

The Events of the Passion Week

Palm Sunday Holy Wednesday Maundy Thursday Good Friday Sunrise Service on Easter Sunday

These are some of the modern traditions that came out of the Catholic church.

• Tradition story – "Mom cutting the ends off the ham."

Most Protestant denominations, coming out of Catholicism, have held onto these.

- Palm Sunday remembered for Messiah's Triumphal Entry
- Holy Wednesday when Judas departed to betray Jesus
- Maundy (Mandatum) Thursday Mandate
- Good Friday Crucifixion
- Sunrise Service on Easter Sunday

Traditions are fine, unless they contradict Scripture

Here is what we know...

1. Jesus Died

_

John 19:30 Jesus...said, "It is finished: and he bowed his head, and gave up the ghost."

2. Jesus Rose Again

- Matt 28:6 He is not here: for he is risen, as he said. Come, see the place where the Lord lay.

3. They Hastily Buried Him BEFORE a <u>HIGH</u> Sabbath (Holy Convocation)

 John 19:31 The Jews therefore, because it was the preparation, that the bodies should not remain upon the cross on the sabbath day, (for that sabbath day was an high day,) besought Pilate that their legs might be broken, and that they might be taken away.

4. They went to visit the tomb AFTER the weekly Sabbath

 John 20:1 The first day of the week cometh Mary Magdalene when it was yet dark unto the Sepulchre and seeth the stone taken away...

5. He would be in the tomb for three days and three nights.

Matt 12:38-40 Then certain of the scribes and of the Pharisees answered, saying, Master, we would see a sign from thee. But he answered and said unto them, An evil and adulterous generation seeketh after a sign; and there shall no sign be given to it, but the sign of the prophet Jonas: For as Jonas was three days and three nights in the whale's belly; so shall the Son of man be three days and three nights in the heart of the earth.

In addition to the weekly Sabbath, there were seven High Sabbaths

Here is what we know...

6. The Ladies bought and prepared spices AFTER the Sabbath, but then rested on the Sabbath AFTER preparing the Spices BEFORE the Sabbath. (Two Sabbaths, not one)

- Luke 23:50-54 And, behold, there was a man named Joseph...he was of Arimathaea...This man went unto Pilate, and begged the body of Jesus. And he took it down, and wrapped it in linen, and laid it in a sepulchre that was hewn in stone, wherein never man before was laid. And that day was the preparation, and the sabbath drew on. And the women also, which came with him from Galilee, followed after, and beheld the sepulchre, and how his body was laid.
- Mark 16:1 And when the sabbath was past, Mary Magdalene, and Mary the mother of James, and Salome, bought sweet spices, that they might come and anoint him.
- Luke 23:55-56 And the women also, which came with him from Galilee, followed after, and beheld the sepulchre, and how his body was laid. And they returned, and prepared spices and ointments; and rested the sabbath day according to the commandment.

TWO Sabbaths Mark 16 – "had" is not in the Greek.




7. Two Seders?

- Luke 22:15-16 And he said unto them, With desire I have desired to eat this passover with you before I suffer: For I say unto you, I will not any more eat thereof, until it be fulfilled in the kingdom of God.
- John 13:29 For some of them thought, because Judas had the bag, that Jesus had said unto him, Buy those things that we have need of against the feast; or, that he should give something to the poor.

TWO Seders

- After the first diaspora in Babylon, they began celebrating two Seders. The new moon could be at 29 or 30 days. The month actually was 29 ½ days. They kept two Seders.
- In the lineage given in Matthew, Joseph was a descendant of **Zerubbabel (who led the remnant back from Babylon).**
- If you lived more than a day's journey from Jerusalem (which the Disciples did from Nazareth), you kept it on two days.
- Jesus said, "I will not eat THIS meal again...until the Kingdom."
- Jesus ate in His resurrected body. Obviously the "I will not eat this meal" had to be speaking of the Seder.





Passion Week – Bethany, Triumphal Entry & Cleansing the Temple.

- John 12:1-3 Then Jesus six days before the passover came to Bethany, where Lazarus was which had been dead, whom he raised from the dead. There they made him a supper; and Martha served: but Lazarus was one of them that sat at the table with him. Then took Mary a pound of ointment of spikenard, very costly, and anointed the feet of Jesus, and wiped his feet with her hair: and the house was filled with the odour of the ointment.
- John 12:12-13 On the next day much people that were come to the feast, when they heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem, Took branches of palm trees, and went forth to meet him, and cried, Hosanna: Blessed is the King of Israel that cometh in the name of the Lord.




Passion Week – Bethany, Triumphal Entry & Cleansing the Temple.

- Mark 11:8-11 And many spread their garments in the way and others cut down branches...cried, saying, Hosanna; Blessed is he that cometh in the name of the Lord. ...And Jesus entered into Jerusalem, and into the temple: and when he had looked round about upon all things, and now the eventide was come, he went out unto Bethany with the twelve.
- Mark 11:12-17 And on the morrow, when they were come from Bethany, ... (15)And they come to Jerusalem: and Jesus went into the temple, and began to cast out them that sold and bought in the temple, and overthrew the tables of the moneychangers...(17) And he taught, saying unto them, Is it not written, My house shall be called of all nations the house of prayer? but ye have made it a den of thieves.




In the tenth day of this month they shall take to them every man a lamb, according to the house of their fathers, a lamb for an house: And if the household be too little for the lamb, let him and his neighbour next unto his house take it according to the number of the souls; every man according to his eating shall make your count for the lamb. Your lamb shall be without blemish, a male of the first year: ye shall take it out from the sheep, or from the goats: And ye shall keep it up until the fourteenth day of the same month: and the whole assembly of the congregation of Israel shall kill it in the evening. And they shall take of the blood, and strike it on the two side posts and on the upper door post of the houses, wherein they shall eat it... And this day shall be unto you for a memorial; and ye shall keep it a feast to the Lord throughout your generations; ye shall keep it a feast by an ordinance for ever. Seven days shall ye eat unleavened bread...And in the first day there shall be an holy convocation, and in the seventh day there shall be an holy convocation to you; no manner of work shall be done in them, save that which every man must eat, that only may be done of you.

John 19:31

Explain the Spring, Summer and Fall feasts


This entire feast was called "Pesach" – However, the Sabbath was the 15th. The lamb was to be killed on the 14th



We start at midnight, have 6 hours of dark, 12 hours of day and 6 hours of dark.






WHAT WE KNOW>>>

(After reviewing screen starting with what we know...at the Friday Crucifixion do all the scenarios)




- Let's assume a Friday crucifixion which would make Saturday the weekly Sabbath and also Passover
- Let's correctly count back six days from the Actual day called the Passover.




- Let's be wrong, but let's identify the Preparation day the day the lamb was killed as "The Passover."
- Well, THAT'S WRONG, but that works....EXCEPT Jesus would have traveled over 20 miles from Jericho to Jerusalem on the Sabbath.
- Like the difference between Christmas Day and Christmas Eve.

- Jesus came out on the First Day of the Week
- The women visited the tomb after the seventh day Sabbath.
- TWO SABBATHS A High Sabbath and a seventh day sabbath. The Women prepared spices after a Sabbath and before a Sabbath.
- Two Seders for those who were part of the Diaspora. Kept by tradition.
- Jesus was crucified on the Preparation Day (14th of Nissan)
- The 15th was a Holy Convocation (High Sabbath First Day of Feast of Unleavened Bread)






- Command given Nehemiah by ARTAXERXES







Dr. Peter Stoner evaluated the odds of these eight prophecies being fulfilled in one man by chance:



What are the odds Of 16 Prophecies Accidentally being Fulfilled by one man?





Odds of fulfilling 48 of the prophecies by chance:

• 1 in 10


