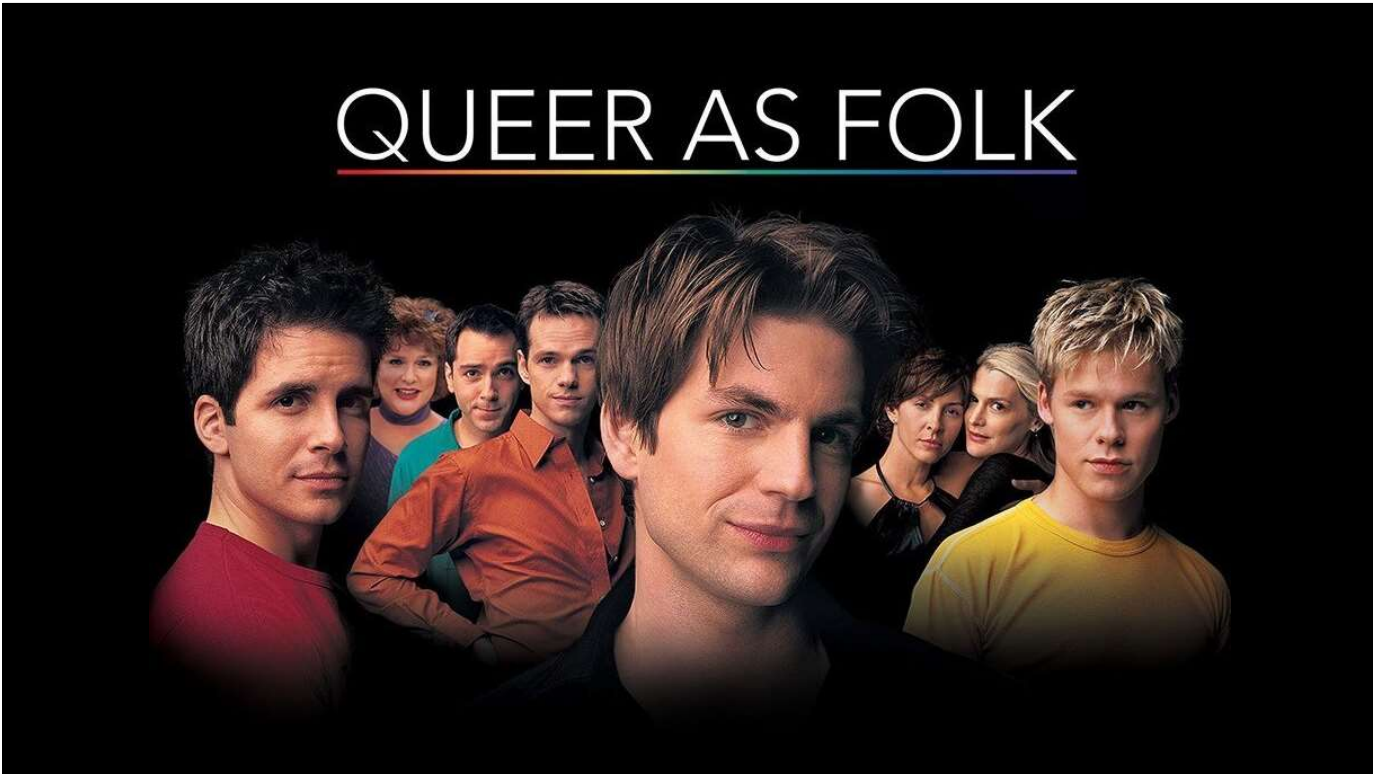

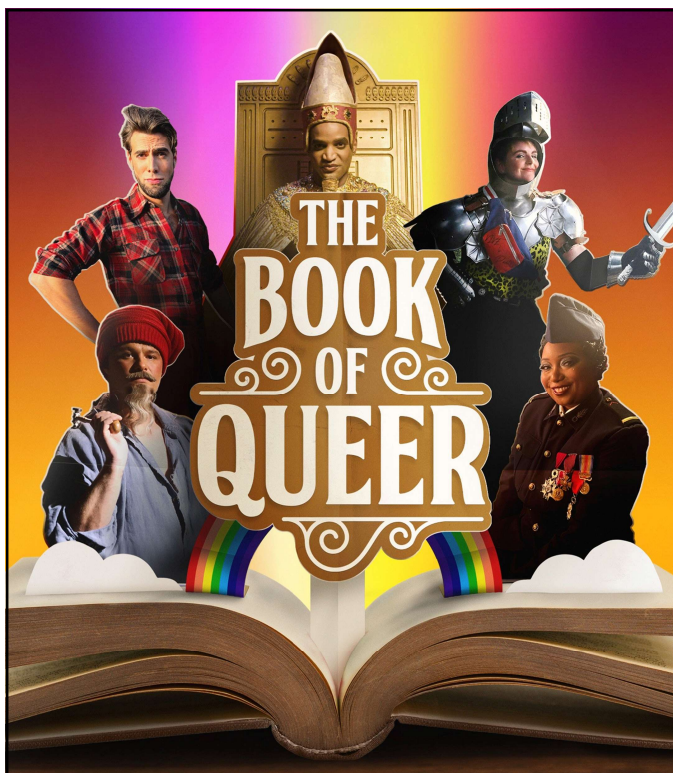

QUEER AS FOLK

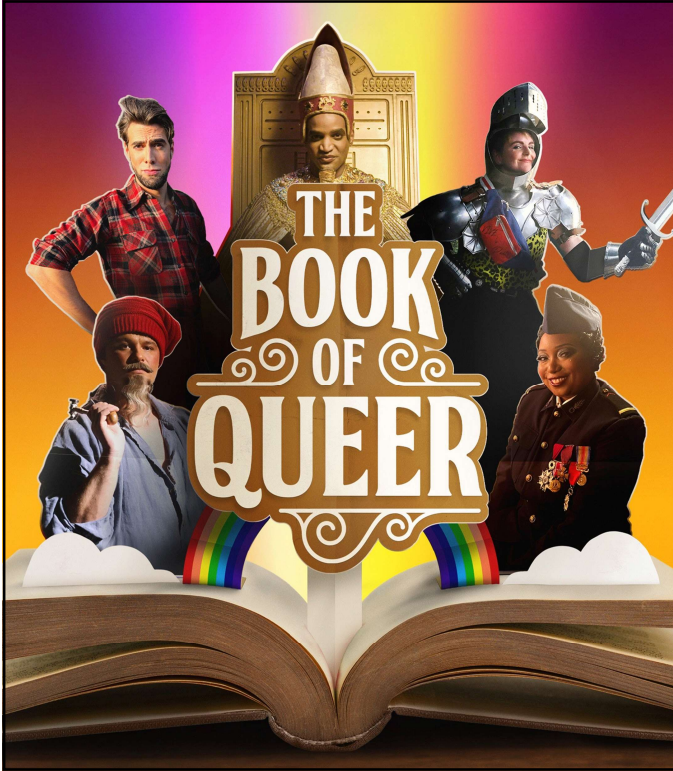
Queer as Folk is a television series that ran from December 3, 2000 to August 7, 2005. The series follows the lives of five gay men living in Pittsburgh, PA.
