Step 2: Control the flow of information (Media)


Step 3: No Freedom of Conscience. (You cannot disagree with your government.)







And further that all parents and masters do breed & bring up their children & apprentices in some honest lawful calling, labour or employment, either in husbandry, or some other trade profitable for themselves...


President John Adams in a letter to the officers of the First Brigade, Third Division, Massachusetts Militia, 11 October, 1798:




We have no government armed with power capable of contending with human passions unbridled by morality and religion. Avarice, ambition, revenge, or gallantry, would break the strongest cords of our Constitution as a whale goes through a net. Our Constitution was made only for a moral and religious people. It is wholly inadequate to the government of any other.

All societies of men must be governed in some way or other. The less they may have of stringent State Government, the more they must have of individual self-government. The less they rely on public law or physical force, the more they must rely on private moral restraint. **Men, in a word, must necessarily be controlled, either by a power within them, or by a power without them; either by the Word of God, or by the strong arm of man; either by the Bible, or by the bayonet.** It may do for other countries and other governments to talk about the State supporting religion. Here, under our own free institutions, it is Religion which must support the State.







THE CONTRAST IN EDUCATION


Constitutional Republic

- Free people delegate limited governmental responsibility via a defined Constitution.
- The government serves “We the People.”
- Families are responsible for providing their children with a broad based education.
- People are free to choose their own career paths and succeed or fail based upon their risk and labor.

Totalitarianism

- People are assets of the state.
- It is the responsibility to manage its assets and trains its subjects to better serve the collective.
- Assets (people) are assigned their responsibilities to the collective based upon their assessments.
- Assessments are made via state-run training and control is maintained through the collection and management of data.

On June 25, 1962, the United States Supreme Court decided in *Engel v. Vitale* that a prayer approved by the New York Board of Regents for use in schools violated the First Amendment by constituting an establishment of religion. The following year, in *Abington School District v. Schempp*, the Court disallowed Bible readings in public schools for similar reasons.



On February 22, 1756, as a young man of only 20, John Adams made the entry in his diary, his idea of a "Eutopian Nation":

Suppose a nation in some distant Region should take **the Bible for their only law Book, and **every member should regulate his conduct by the precepts there exhibited!** Every member would be obliged in conscience, to temperance, frugality, and industry; to justice, kindness, and charity towards his fellow men; and to piety, love, and reverence toward Almighty God...What a Eutopia, what a Paradise would this region be.**
