Christians are commanded to know what they believe, why they believe it, & to give answers to those who ask.



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1. The "Cosmological Argument": the universe had a beginning

- Everything that had a beginning had a cause
- The universe had a beginning
- Therefore the universe had a cause

Premise 1: everything that had a beginning had a cause

- The Law of <u>Causality</u> is the fundamental principle of science.
- Francis Bacon (father of modern science): "True knowledge is knowledge by <u>causes</u>."
- Science is a <u>search for causes</u>.




Premise 2: the universe had a beginning

(The laws of thermodynamics)

- Law 1: the total amount of usable energy in the universe is <u>finite</u>.
- Law 2 (Law of Entropy): things tend to go from <u>order</u> to disorder.
- The universe cannot be eternal, because if it were, we would have reached <u>complete disorder</u> (entropy) by now.

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"... the Second Law of Thermodynamics holds, I think, the supreme position among the laws of Nature. ... if your theory is found to be against the Second Law of Thermodynamics I can give you no hope; there is nothing for it but to collapse in deepest humiliation."
