

Is there enough evidence to support the claims of Scripture – especially when it comes to Christmas?









"carefully and accurately recorded Peter's eyewitness observations. ... [Mark] made no mistake and did not include any false statement."





























If Jesus was crucified in 30 A.D.






"The interval then between the dates of original composition and the earliest extant evidence becomes so small as to be in fact negligible, and the last foundation for any doubt that the Scriptures come down to have US substantially as they were written has now been removed. Both the the general authenticity and integrity of the books of the New Testament may be regarded as finally established.







