




## 70 years in captivity in Babylon

606 BC to 536 BC





536BC – Cyrus allows Zerubbabel to lead Jews who wish to return back home to Israel. Only 50,000 (approximately) return. They start rebuilding the Altar and the Temple.



The Samaritans successfully get the building of the Temple stopped and it remains stopped until

520 BC





### Order of revelations:

- Month 1 Haggai Rebuild (1:1) (2<sup>nd</sup> Year of Darius, 6
   mo. 1<sup>st</sup> day)
- Month 2 Haggai Encouragement (2:1) (7 mo. 21<sup>st</sup> day)
- Month 3 Zechariah Get with it (Zech 1:1-6) (8 mo.)
- Month 4 Haggai Confirmation (9 mo. 24<sup>th</sup> day)
- 19 months later Zechariah's ten visions in one night with encouraging promises of the future.

Vision #1 - The Angel of the LORD taking note of the state of the world. Vision #2 (&3) - Four horn and four smiths Vision #4 – City Planning for the future Vision #5 (& 6) = The calling and cleansing of Joshua the High Priest and the **Branch** ision #7 - Two Olive Trees Vision #8 = The Flying Roll (Scroll) Vision #9 -Wickedness Carried to Babylon Vision #10 - Four Horsemen/Chariots

Gifts brought from Jews in Babylon are made into crowns of silver (priesthood/redemption) and gold (royalty) and Joshua the High Priest is crowned SYMBOLICALLY.

Zerubbabel (although of the house of David) was NOT crowned.


Joshua did NOT actually rule or reign.

It was a picture of the promised Seed of David who would RULE as a PRIEST after the order of MelkiZedek.

# ECHARIA Blair: Study of Zechariah (Lesson 3) -1 Triru a-23

#### Zech 7:1-3

- 1 And it came to pass in the fourth year of king Darius, that the word of the Lord came unto Zechariah in the fourth day of the ninth month, even in Chisleu;
- <sup>2</sup> When they had sent unto the house of God (Bethel) Sherezer and Regem-melech, and their men, to pray before the Lord,
- <sup>3</sup> And to speak unto the priests which were in the house of the Lord of hosts, and to the prophets, saying, Should I weep in the fifth month, separating myself, as I have done these so many years?



1313 BCE: The spies returned from the Promised Land with frightening reports, and the Israelites balked at the prospect of entering the land. G-d decreed that they would therefore wander in the desert for 40 years. Read more.



Both Holy Temples in Jerusalem were destroyed on this date. The First Temple was burned by the Babylonians in 423 BCE (read more) and the Second Temple fell to the Romans in 70 CE (read more), unleashing a period of suffering from which our nation has never fully recovered.

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The Bar Kochba revolt against the Romans in 133 CE ended in defeat: The Jews of Betar were butchered on the 9th of Av and the Temple Mount was plowed one year later on the same date. Read more.

Later on in our history, many more tragedies happened on this day, including the 1290 expulsion of England's Jews and the 1492 banishment of all Jews from Spain. Read more.

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The fast begins at sunset of the 8th of Av and concludes at nightfall the following night (delayed by one day when 9 Av is on Shabbat). During this time, we do not

- eat or drink
- wear leather footwear
- bathe or wash ourselves (washing only until the knuckle when mandated by halachah)
- apply ointments or creams
- engage in marital relations or any form of intimacy
- sit on a normal-height chair until chatzot (the time when the sun has reached its apex)
- study Torah (except for the "sad" parts that deal with the destruction of the Temples, etc.)
- send gifts, or even greet one another (you may respond to greetings)
- engage in outings, trips or similar pleasurable activities
- wear fine, festive clothing







#### Zech 7:11-14

- 11 But they refused to hearken, and pulled away the shoulder, and stopped their ears, that they should not hear.
- 12 Yea, they made their hearts as an adamant stone, lest they should hear the law, and the words which the Lord of hosts hath sent in his spirit by the former prophets: therefore came a great wrath from the Lord of hosts.




#### Zech 8:1-3

Again the word of the Lord of hosts came to me, saying, Thus saith the Lord of hosts; I was jealous for Zion with great jealousy, and I was jealous for her with great fury.

3 Thus saith the Lord; I am returned unto Zion, and will dwell in the midst of Jerusalem: and Jerusalem shall be called a city of truth; and the mountain of the Lord of hosts the holy mountain.



**KJV** - cruel (-ty), damage, false, injustice, X oppressor, unrighteous, violence (against, done), violent (dealing), wrong.

#### **VIOLENCE – actions motivated through hatred or greed.**

Greed motivated the rich and powerful to exploit the powerless, robbing them of their rightful property Amos condemned the wealthy leaders of Samaria for storing up "violence and robbery in their strongholds".
