

The blood covenant is the main subject of Scripture – the Old Covenant and the New Covenant


The secret of the Lord is with those who fear Him, and He will show them His covenant. Ps 25:14

"This cup is the new covenant in My blood, which is shed for you." Lk 22:20












Heb 2:15 and release those who through fear of death were all their lifetime subject to bondage.


Jesus has taken on death –

Heb 2:14 that through death He might destroy him who had the power of death, that is, the devil, _____


Col 2:15 Having disarmed principalities and powers, He made a public spectacle of them, triumphing over them in it.

Rom 6:19 I speak in human terms because of the weakness of your flesh.



If Abraham had walked between the pieces of the sacrifice and had made the covenant himself, he would have been bound by the terms (blessings and curses) of the covenant.

If he had failed, the curses would have been upon him – and his descendants.





Heb 6:13 For when God made a promise to Abraham, because He could swear by no one greater, He swore by Himself, ¹⁴ saying, "Surely blessing I will bless you, and multiplying I will multiply you."

Gal 3:29 And if you are Christ's, then you are Abraham's seed, and heirs according to the promise.
