Points to Remember

1. Prophecy is Pattern, not just prediction and fulfillment.

Hosea 12:10

I have also spoken by the prophets, and I have multiplied visions, and used *similitudes*, by the ministry of the prophets.

Definition of **SIMILITUDE**

counterpart, double, a visible likeness, an imaginative comparison, simile

For the law having a *shadow* of good things to come...

Hebrews 8:5

Who serve unto the *example* and *shadow* of heavenly things, as Moses was admonished of God...

Which was a *figure* for the time then present...

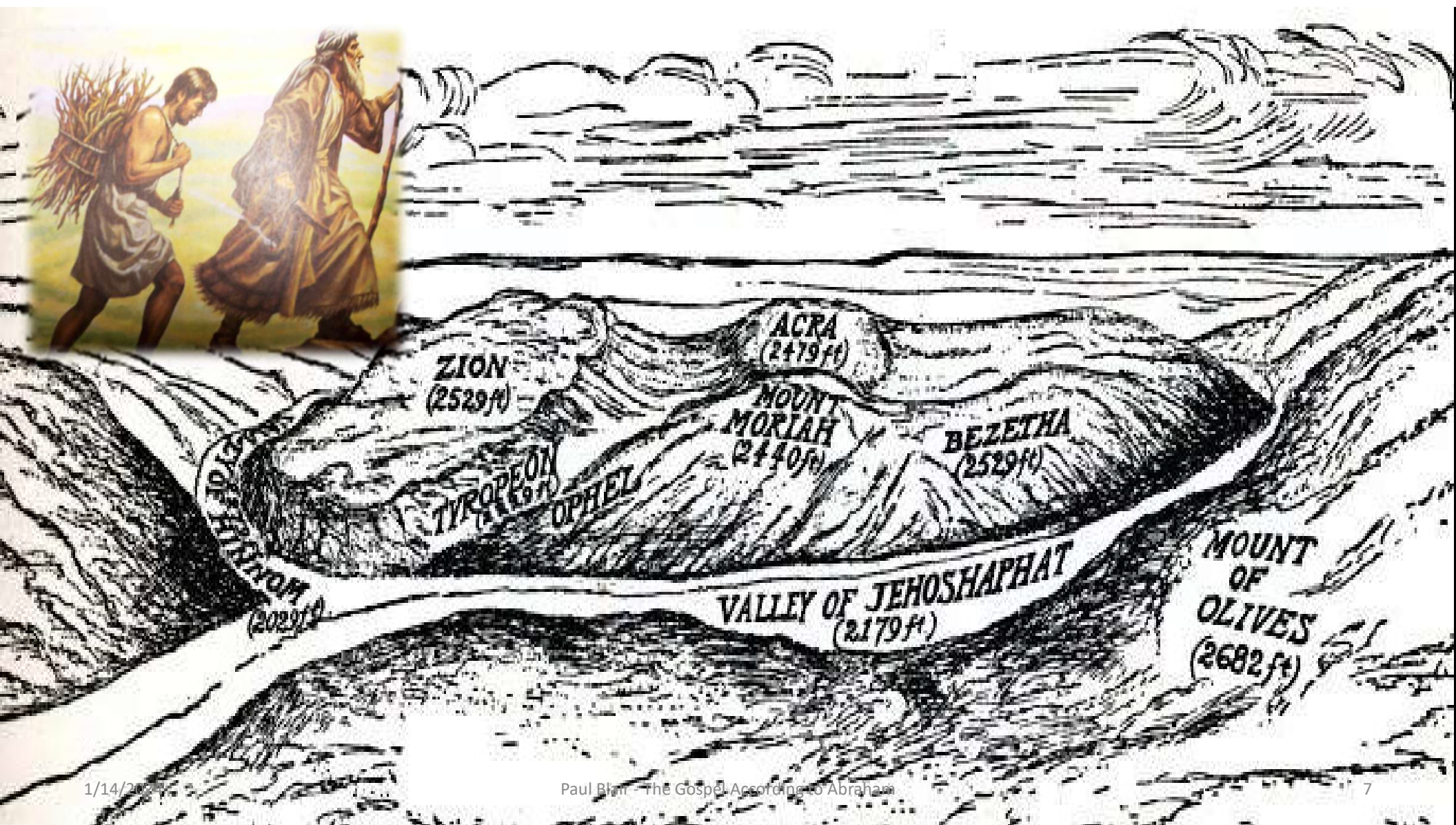
Hebrews 9:23

Gen 22:2

*And he said, **Take now thy son, thine only son Isaac, whom thou lovest**, and get thee into the land of Moriah; and offer him there for a burnt offering upon one of the mountains which I will tell thee of.*





Gen 22:4

Then on the third day Abraham lifted up his eyes, and saw the place afar off...(7-8)...And Isaac spake unto Abraham his father, and said, *“My father”: and he said, “Here am I, my son.” And he said, “Behold the fire and the wood: but where is the lamb for a burnt offering?”*





Gen 22:8

And Abraham said, My son, **God will provide himself a lamb** for a burnt offering: so they went both of them together.

Gen 22:5-6

And Abraham said unto his young men, Abide ye here with the ass; and I and the lad will go yonder and worship, and come again to you, And Abraham took the wood of the burnt offering, and laid it upon Isaac his son; and he took the fire in his hand, and a knife; and they went both of them together.







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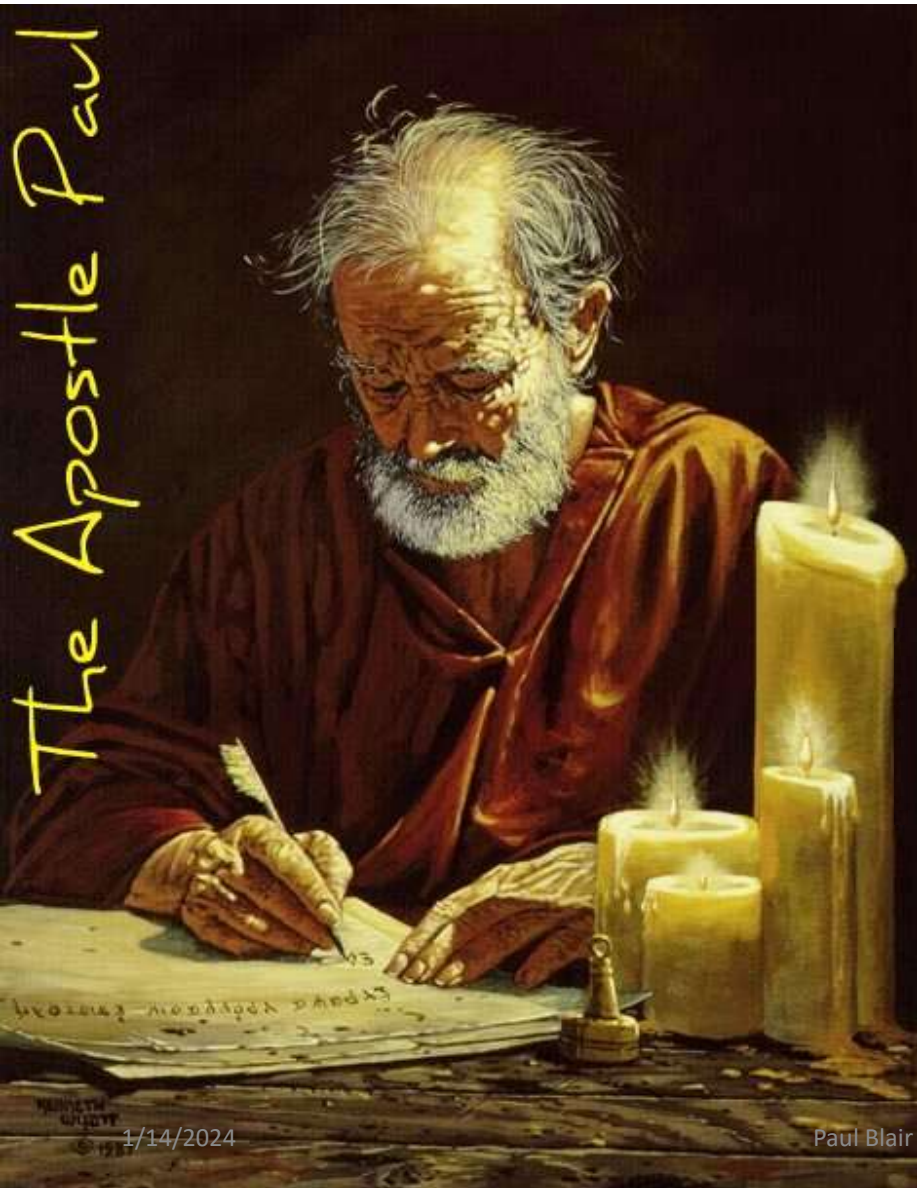

Moreover, brethren, I declare unto you the gospel which I preached unto you, which also ye have received, and wherein ye stand; By which also ye are saved, if ye keep in memory what I preached unto you, unless ye have believed in vain.

For I delivered unto you first of all that which I also received, how that **Christ died for our sins according to the scriptures; And that he was buried, and that he rose again the third day according to the scriptures:**

Where?

In Jonah, we see a type of three days dead. Here in Genesis, do we see the beloved SON dead to his FATHER for three days and then restored.



(v. 19) So Abraham returned unto his young men, and they rose up and went together to Beer-sheba; and Abraham dwelt at Beer-sheba.

- Abraham sends his un-named servant to find a Gentile Bride for his son
- The un-named servant asks Rebekah to become married to the father's son
- She accepts
- The purchase price is paid – covenant completed
- The bride is given gifts
- The Promised Miracle Son meets His Bride at Beer Lahoi-roi - well of life and sight (Living Water)
- The un-named servant (no attention to him) is Eleazor (God's Helper/Comforter)

**Isaac is the Bridegroom and
Rebekah is the Bride in type.**

**Jesus is the Bridegroom and
we are the Bride of Christ in
anti-type.**

John 3:28-30

I am not the Christ...I am sent before him.

He that hath the bride is the bridegroom: but the friend of the bridegroom, which standeth and heareth him, rejoiceth greatly because of the bridegroom's voice: this my joy therefore is fulfilled. He must increase, but I must decrease.

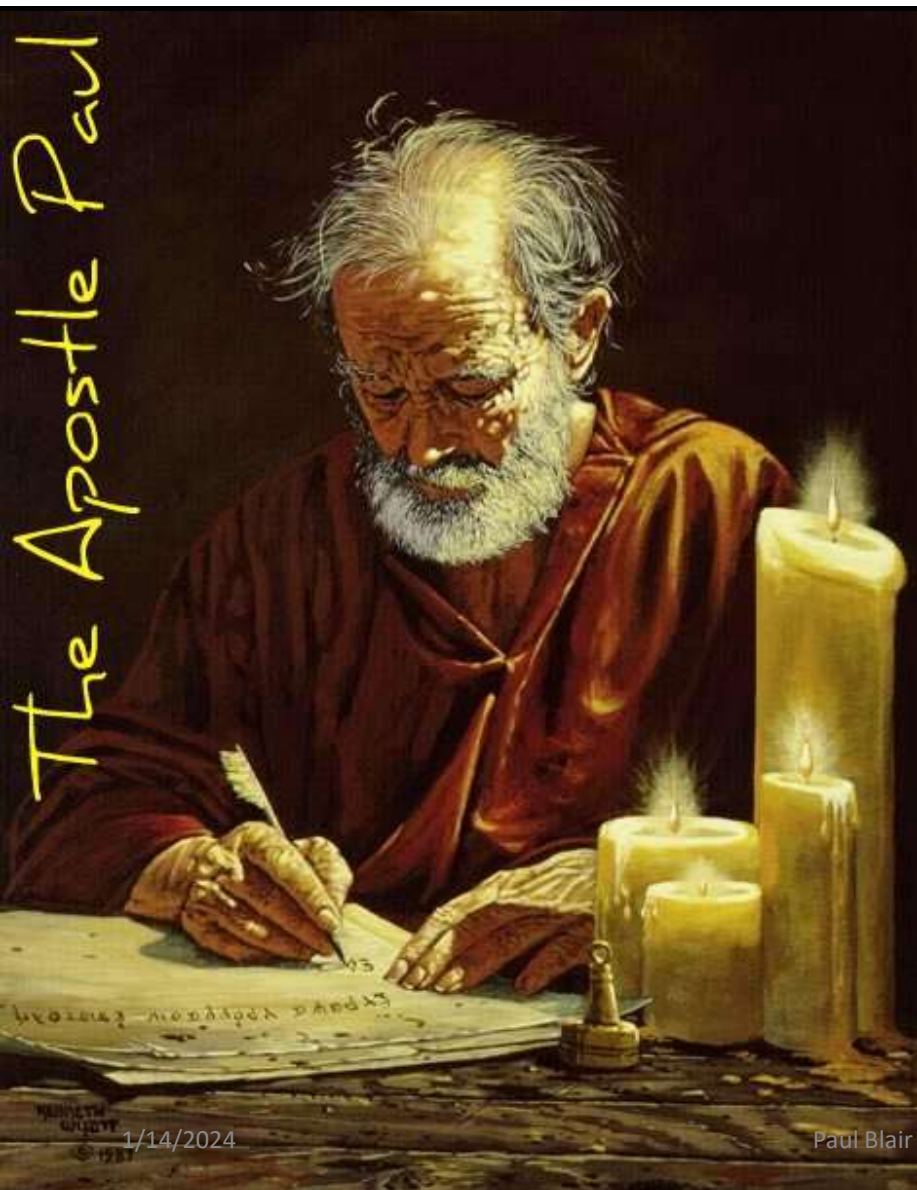




Matt 9:15

Jewish Wedding



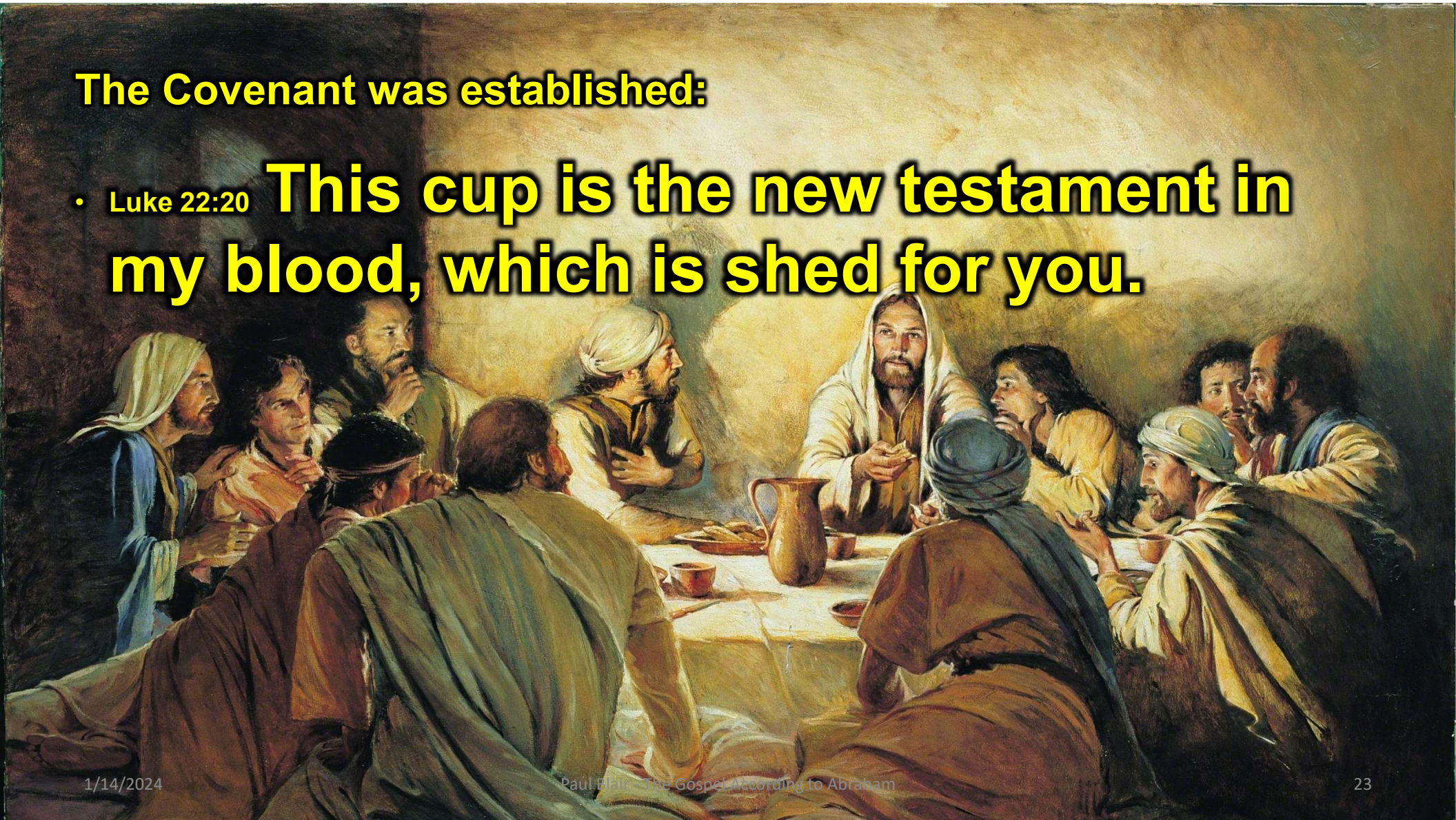
- **Ketubah** – Marriage contract and purchase
- **Kiddushen** – Betrothal period
- Bridegroom comes for his Bride
- Wedding Feast – 7 Days

The Father has sent out the Holy Spirit (Comforter) to search for His Bride. The purchase price was paid as:

- **Eph 5:25** *Husbands, love your wives, even as Christ also loved the church, and gave himself for it;*
- **John 3:16** *For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life.*
- **1 Peter 1:18-19** *Forasmuch as ye know that ye were not redeemed with corruptible things, as silver and gold, from your vain conversation received by tradition from your fathers; But with the precious blood of Christ, as of a lamb without blemish and without spot:*
- **Acts 20:28** *Take heed therefore unto yourselves, and to all the flock, over the which the Holy Ghost hath made you overseers, to feed the church of God, which he hath purchased with his own blood.*

The Covenant was established:

- **Luke 22:20 This cup is the new testament in my blood, which is shed for you.**



Jesus said that He must return to His Father's House, but he was going there to prepare a place for us and then come again to receive us unto Himself:

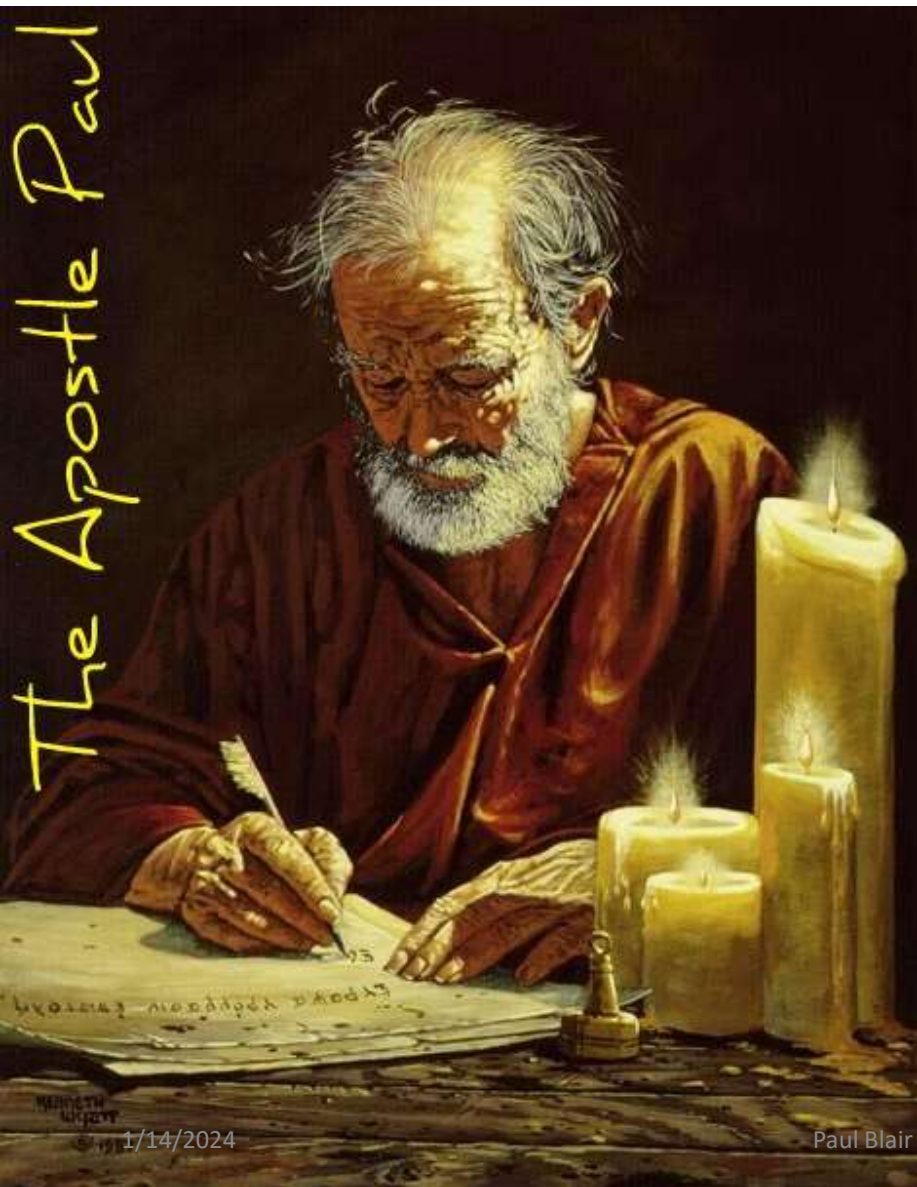
Jn 14:2-3 *In my Father's house are many mansions: if it were not so, I would have told you. I go to prepare a place for you. And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again, and receive you unto myself; that where I am, there ye may be also.*



Christ is the Bridegroom and the Church is called His Bride:

- Eph. 5:25-27--- *...just as Christ also loved the church and gave Himself up for her; that He might sanctify her, having cleansed her by the washing of water with the word, that He might present to Himself the church in all her glory, having no spot or wrinkle or any such thing; but that she should be holy and blameless.*

What Is a Jewish Wedding?

A **traditional Jewish wedding** (called a *chatunah*, חתונה) is a tapestry woven from many threads: biblical, historical, mystical, cultural and legal. Threads carried from one

The Jewish wedding typically starts in midafternoon and ends late at night, but it can be longer or shorter. It is generally followed by seven days of celebration (*sheva brachot*, שבוע ברכות).

But a marriage is also an intricate legal transaction, by which **bride and groom** enter a mutually binding commitment. The rituals and customs of the Jewish wedding derive from both its legalistic particulars and its underlying spiritual themes—the body and soul of the **Jewish wedding**.

- Bride purifies herself/prepares for wedding
- By Surprise, the Groom comes to TAKE his Bride for seven days of feasting.
